## More than a cardboard box full of food. An invitation to community ... to Jesus ... to NEW LIFE!

Just two years ago, they were strangers.
Sixteen families who were struggling in Houston's inner city. Caught in the relentless race to make ends meet and put food on the table all on their own.

But now? They're your brothers and sisters in Christ!

The story of how this miracle happened begins with 36 Boxes of Love® — given by generous friends like you — and a new approach to distribution that Cru® Inner City's 30-plus expansion cities had just launched, called the Embracing Families Strategy.

With this strategy, partner ministries focused on establishing relationships with recipients first — well before offering Compassionate Products™ (like Boxes of Love) or making gospel presentations. This plan is designed to cultivate deeper relationships that create fertile ground

for ministry — including Compassionate Product distributions, gospel engagements, follow-up, and discipleship.

So when Friend of Jesus Church in Houston received those 36 Boxes of Love — each filled with a turkey and all the trimmings for a Thanksgiving dinner



for six, plus gospel literature — they intentionally reached out to 36 specific marginalized families their congregation had already been getting to know.

"It's so important that every box has a name," says Bryant Lee, National Expansion Director for Inner City, "but mainly what's important is that we do the follow up work."

And Friend of Jesus Church did just that. They didn't just knock on the door, leave the Boxes of

Love, and disappear — they maintained contact with each family post-distribution by praying together and checking in regularly.

As a result, friendships deepened. The gospel message penetrated hearts even more powerfully. And sixteen of these families are now attending Friend of Jesus, according to Pastor Mario Valle, Jr., who leads the congregation his parents began more than a decade ago.

"We went from being just friends to now being

sisters and brothers in Christ," Pastor Mario says.

"The Boxes of Love have been a big impact, not just for the church, but for the whole community. We have been able to show our community the love Jesus Christ has for them.

"I believe that the Boxes of Love are a great tool to be able to get to those families in need and speak to them about the love of Jesus. It lets us get closer to our community's needs."

Adding to the excitement, on the congregation's 13<sup>th</sup> anniversary this June, the church hosted a baptism service where "many of those families that received Boxes of Love got baptized," Pastor Mario reports.

"That shows us that the Boxes of Love are not covering just the basic needs, but they're covering more. They're going above and beyond. ... They're in people's hearts now, showing that by baptizing themselves. They're turning everything in ... to Jesus Christ."

### A young life — transformed!

If you knew Devon at age 15, you might have described him as rough around the edges.

He didn't go to school. Instead, he roamed the streets all day. His home life was broken.

But Pastor Brian Evans didn't write Devon off
— or any of the teens in their Detroit community.
Having grown up in a fatherless home and a
neighborhood ravaged by alcohol, drugs, and
violence himself, he's determined to offer teens
like Devon the gift he received from his uncle, a
pastor: Jesus Christ.

That's why he teamed up with Cru<sup>®</sup> Inner City to launch New Generation, an after-school S.A.Y. Yes!<sup>®</sup> Center at the congregation he pastors.

Through the program, Pastor Brian met Devon and began mentoring him. It wasn't long before the teen began responding to his consistent influence.

"You could see a change in him," Pastor Brian remembers, "and he received Christ."

Today, Devon attends church regularly and

is enrolled in the Job Corps, about to earn his diploma — a role model to other teens in the S.A.Y. Yes! program.

"They have seen the dramatic change in his life," Pastor Brian remarks. "He's a visible example of how God can change somebody's life and change their direction."

S.A.Y. Yes! Centers, like the one that reached Devon, provide tutoring, mentoring, Bible instruction, other activities, and snacks to young people after school.

As the trio headed out of the store, they met volunteers from Fresh Anointing International Ministry, which was inviting shoppers to its annual back-to-school festival underway nearby.

"We began to minister about the good news, and she began to break down in tears," says Dr. Heidi Ellis, who leads the congregation. "She didn't know what she was going to do about providing and meeting the needs for the kids in the new school they are now attending."

Dr. Ellis and her team listened to Mallarie's story, fed her family, gave her school uniforms and a PowerPack® for both children. PowerPacks®

— beautiful backpacks — are provided to Fresh Anointing through partnership with Cru® Inner City. They are filled with school supplies like spiral notebooks, pocket folders, pens, pencils, crayons, glue sticks, and age-appropriate gospel literature.

After they shared the gospel and prayed over Mallarie and her kids, the mom was so touched, she and her children attended services at Fresh Anointing the next day and joined the church.

"We will be watching over them and continue to spread the gospel to them," Dr. Ellis said.

# A Passionate Vision for Sacred Spaces

During Paul's Second Missionary journey, he traveled with Timothy and Silas to Troas. While still in

Troas, Paul was sleeping when he had a vision of a man from Macedonia who "was standing there, urging him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us'" (Acts 16:9, ESV).

And when Paul had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them.

- Acts 16:10

Notice the direct request of the Macedonian's invitation: come over and help. He didn't ask Paul's team to serve them or take over their work. They needed a partner. Centuries later, the call of the Macedonian has become Cru® Inner City's ministry model, as we continually seek to expand our reach in urban communities.

At the heart of expansion is identifying the people already at work doing what God has called them to do and seeking to establish a partnership with them. As we do so, our framework involves submitting ourselves to our inner-city partners. Our core value is to work alongside them, not to impose our will. We want to hear and serve according to their heart.

In addition to that partnership, my vision is for our staff expansion teams to be fully engaged in making disciples through four specific goals to maximize Gospel exposure:

- 1. Ministering to the whole person
- 2. Developing discipleship relationships



- 3. Training believers to serve in ministry
- 4. Recruiting new staff

I believe this vision aligns with God's Great Commandment and Great Commission to love Him, love others, and make disciples of all nations. For our unique piece of that Kingdom call, we are focused on a particular space within the nations. Our inner-city space is where people are oftentimes ignored, assumed about, and marginalized. People tend to throw these residents away.

I have a passion for this space because, for one, it's my people. And two, our inner-city spaces are becoming more and more diverse, reflecting God's call for all nations. God is sending the world to us. There are people of every tribe and tongue coming to these spaces in such a way that we'll never be without a job. We will always have a place to live out this Commandment and Commission.

#### 4 Powerful Ways to Share God's Love at Year's End

- 1 IRA rollover. If you're 70½ years or older, you can make a qualified charitable donation (QCD) of up to \$108,000 directly from your IRA without adding a penny to your taxable income. For most people aged 73 or older, this likely counts toward your required minimum distribution (check with your financial advisor to confirm).
- a charitable income tax deduction if you have owned the asset (stocks; bonds; real estate such as homes, vacation properties, commercial or undeveloped land) longer than 12 months. By donating the asset directly to Cru® Inner City (rather than selling it outright and donating the proceeds), you will likely avoid the capital gains tax on the appreciation AND your generosity will make an even greater impact serving the poor and marginalized in America's inner cities.
- 3 Donor Advised Fund (DAF) distribution.
  You've already set these funds aside
  for ministry and year's end can be a
  wonderful time to release them to meet
  needs. Many in the inner-city struggle
  at the close of the year, with dropping
  temperatures as winter sets in and
  challenges making ends meet through the

- Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. With a gift from your DAF, you can extend God's love to those in need at this critical time of year without touching your ready capital.
- **4 Cash gift.** Any generous donation you give mailed or given online by midnight December 31 may apply toward this year's taxes.
