A Broken Heart Resurrected



Valerie's heart was broken.

She recently lost her 17-year-old daughter, Britany, on the operating table as the teen was undergoing her second liver transplant in 13 years.

Adding to the deep sorrow, Valerie's marriage crumbled under the grief. Skyscraper-sized medical bills began piling up. Valerie's once-strong faith faltered. It was difficult to see God in life's carnage.

When Easter arrived months later, the single mom, still in a haze of grief, had no idea how to salvage the holiday for her six foster children — all under the age of eight — each child also drifting through grief and loss.

Even in the midst of her pain, Valerie found purpose again through her relationship with God.

Then, Valerie received an invitation to an Easter event at Body of Christ Church, where she attended before life wore her down. During the Resurrection Sunday event, children received Easter Bags provided through the inner-city ministry of Cru[®],



filling a void for Valerie. The festive bags contained candy, snacks, and gospel literature, including a booklet called, Welcome to Heaven. The booklet

prompted all sorts of questions from Valerie's grieving youngsters.

Where is Britany? Did she go to heaven? Is she in pain?

"The (book's) pictures and content helped the children understand what their sister went through and where they could go when it was their time to be with the Lord," said Tonya Harris of Body of Christ Church. "They confessed that they wanted to go to heaven, to see God and their sister."

The event also proved to be a salve for Valerie.

"It was like the light kind of came back on," Tonya shared. "Even in the midst of her pain, Valerie found purpose again through her relationship with God. Now she's participating in church more and more, and her children just love being in the ministry."

serving in the inner city, hurting people in some of America's most vulnerable communities are finding the light of Christ amid darkness.

Then, using the gospel tracts within

the Box of Love, the church volunteers prayed with Maria and her children — and **led all three to a personal relationship with Jesus!**

Thanks to your prayers and support, similar scenes played out in cities across the nation this holiday season. While some numbers are still outstanding, November's Boxes of Love[®] campaign resulted in the distribution of over 19,000 boxes by 333 partner ministries in at least 19 cities — so far. To God be the glory!

These life-changing exchanges don't just happen during Box of Love distributions or in follow-up during subsequent months. A foundational element of the campaign is <u>pre-event evangelism training</u> where ministry leaders learn how to effectively share the love of Jesus with the families who receive Boxes of Love. In one training, 40 participants spent two hours in a workshop before hitting the streets to offer prayer and talk to people about Jesus. As a Thank you for making it possible. A personal word from Milton Massie Remembering Steve Douglass

In October, Cru® worldwide said goodbye to Steve Douglass, who served as ministry president for 19 years. His obituary includes significant tributes to his extended service with Cru, logging 51 years. He was also an author and radio host. He was a husband, father, and grandfather, until

complications from cancer returned him to the arms of his Father.

Steve was much more than the obituary checklist. He was a statesman, a shepherd, and a soul-care surgeon.

Although Steve navigated an international ministry with several distinct aims, Cru's ministry in the inner city held a special place in his heart. He and his wife, Judy, were allies and advocates for the marginalized, promoting our work through videos, fundraisers, and radio.

Always eager to hear what we were trusting the Lord for, Steve gave Cru Inner City the freedom to do what it did best. Knowing that he believed in us, and our vision, was liberating, encouraging, and invigorating.

In 2020, just before his retirement, Steve reviewed our Strategic Plan, a ministry blueprint leading into 2023. He called me personally to express how excited he was about the vision, committing to join us in our prayers that the Lord would deliver.

As a shepherd, Steve celebrated each of our unique qualities, never lumping us together in a sea of sameness. He lived out Romans 12:10 by always deferring to others and elevating them above himself. He was eager to hear stories on how God was moving through Inner City and our established partnerships.



Partnership was one of his favorite words, and he believed our partnerships with local churches were the most effective way to bring the gospel to places where most people didn't want to go.

While our common goal was the work of the gospel, Steve never forgot about the gospel at work in each one of us, the matters of soul care. He frequently called asking, "How may I pray for you?" The power of those six words on my behalf, and for the wider needs of Cru Inner City, was life-affirming.

Hebrews 13:7 (ESV) tells us, *Remember your* leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith.

Steve Douglass is somebody I want to imitate. I desire our entire ministry to be as faithful to the call of God. I pray our team embraces the biblical mandates to Win, Build, and Send, as found in the context of both the Great Commandment and the Great Commission.

Will we leave a legacy where people can pick up the baton and walk in the same path of faithfulness?

That is my prayer. And that is the legacy we are committed to leaving.

582,462

According to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, 582,462 people were experiencing homelessness on a single night in January 2022 ... an increase in the number of people experiencing homelessness from 2020 to 2022.

50,767

50,767 of those people were families with children.

233,832

233,832 people experienced <u>unsheltered</u> homelessness in 2022, a sharp increase from previous years.

Steve was 42, homeless and alone, when a deacon from All Nations Church of God first met him on the streets of Chicago.

Steve listened intently as the ministry leader encouraged him to visit the church, where Steve would have access to a variety of resources.

After taking the deacon's words to heart, Steve set out for All Nations on the following Sunday. He was not prepared for what came next.

As Steve entered through the front doors, members of the congregation embraced the man who was invisible to so many. <u>The deacon gave</u> <u>Steve a warm smile and a Homeless Care Kit, both</u> <u>designed to counter the cold Chicago winter</u>.

Each care kit contains a warm blanket, socks,

gloves, a scarf, toiletries and gospel literature. The inner-city ministry of Cru[®] donated the Homeless Care Kits to All Nations, their partner ministry.
