- How would having a coach benefit you as you enter into a new stage of life after college?

Read: "I Needed Encouragement"

- Can you see the value in having a coach in this season?
- What are some of the challenges you perceive you may encounter?

Our human tendency is to be that of an independent spirit. We've been taught our entire lives that we can do whatever we put our minds to. Although this may true, we need help along the way. There are those that have already had the life experiences you'll soon encounter and would be filled with joy at the opportunity to encourage you through them. Don't pass up on this need. Find a coach.

Don't assume, "I'll be fine." Find a coach --- a mentor!
